The EPQ is a chance to stretch yourself academically and investigate a topic which fascinates you. This may compliment your choice of A levels and the research must be original and look beyond the core curriculum. It is a standalone qualification and is worth UCAS points.

As senior students at Immanuel you will act as role models for the other students and will be encouraged to take an active role in helping to shape the future of post 16. We work closely with students to ensure that learning needs are met. You will be assigned a tutor group and your tutor will provide personalised pastoral care and support. One to one mentoring ensures that you will receive the support and guidance that you need during your post 16 time at Immanuel.
