What is Risalah?

Books: The Quran is the dictated word of Allah and is perfect. The Torah and Bible were from Allah but are now in corrupted form because they've been adapted.

Muhammad: He is considered to be the 'seal of the prophets', meaning the final one. As Allah sent the Quran to him, no other prophets are thought to be needed.

RISALAH
Communication between man and Allah in the form of Angels, Holy books and Prophets

Angels: These have been used to relay messages – particularly Jibril, who relayed the Quran to Muhammad. They are not physical but are seen in human form by chosen people. They are in constant contact with the world.

Prophets: Muslims believe there have been 124,000 of these including Adam, Moses (Musa) and Jesus (Isa). Only 313 are messengers from Allah, however, and the others are considered significant figures but not messengers. 2 types of prophets – **Rasul** (messengers – deliver divine revelation everywhere) and **Nabi** (given revelation of an important nature – concerning them or their communities)

What is Tawhid?

- This is the most fundamental belief in Islam – that there is no God except Allah, and his qualities are unique to Him.
- Allah is, amongst other things, considered to be:
 - Loving
 - Powerful
 - Merciful
 - One
 - Incomparable to any other being or thing
 - Supreme
 - Eternal and not made by anything

The Qur'an on Tawhid:
He is God, the One, God the eternal. He begets not nor was He begotten. No one is comparable to him.'
