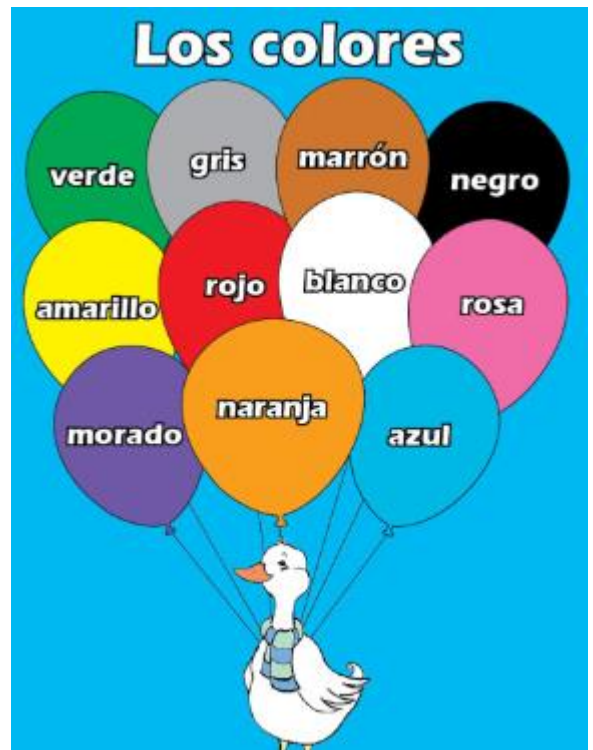

Skills- Using a dictionary:

Remember there are 2 parts to a Spanish- English dictionary: choose the side where you already have the word in that language. It will help you know if a noun is masculine or feminine and you'll be able to use the correct word for a/the:

Nm = noun (masc)

Nf = noun (feminine)

Vb = verb (you will only find the fullest form of the verb - the infinitive 'to go/ be/do)

Adj = adjective

Advb = adverb

el- the (masculine) la – the (feminine) un -a (masculine) una – a (feminine)
