The nature in all seasons, that's why my artwork is focused on landscape, flowers and still life. It's the painterly-technique that allows me to paint in an impressionistic impasto style. Smearing bold layers of bright colours, one applied atop the other very thickly - mixed partly right on the canvas. When dry, the painting looks almost remain visible and the paint appears to be coming out of the canvas. Impasto gives texture to the painting and it becomes almost three-dimensional.
